

Reference formatting using EndNote

This instructional sheet assumes that you are familiar with the basics of using EndNote for storing references and writing scientific papers.

The *Agriculturae Conspectus Scientificus* style template was created to help the authors in building the Reference list for their manuscripts and facilitate citing while writing. The template was built under EndNote version X7.

The style was designed to follow the [Author Guidelines](#) provided by the Journal and was modified accordingly. Due to the limitations of the software, some manual corrections of the text will possibly be required.

Installing the style

- Extract the **Agriculturae Conspectus Scientificus.ens** and run it by double-clicking it.
- The style should open in EndNote.
- With style being open, go to **“File”** menu and choose **“Save As”** and save the style.
- Click on the **“File”** menu and choose **“Close Style”**.
- Extract the **Agriculturae Conspectus Scientificus.xml**
- Click on the **“Edit”** menu and choose **“Preferences...”**.
- On the left side select **“Reference Types”** and under **“Reference Type Table”** select **“Import...”** and choose the extracted **.xml** file, click **“OK”**.
- Go back to your EndNote Library and go to **“Select Another Style”** and choose it from the list.

Using the style

The style was designed to be used as any other EndNote reference style with few minor exceptions:

1. **Journal articles without DOI:**
 - when creating a new reference, under **“Reference Type”** select **“Journal article without DOI”**,
 - or if importing the reference from an outside source (using RIS etc.), enter the imported reference by double-clicking it and change the **“Reference Type”** to **“Journal article without DOI”**.

2. **Journal article in original language other than English:**

- when creating a new reference, under **“Reference Type”** select **“Journal article in original language other than English”** and enter the language of the article in **“Language”** field,
 - or if importing the reference from an outside source (using RIS etc.), enter the imported reference by double-clicking it and change the **“Reference Type”** to **“Journal article in original language other than English”** and enter the language of the article in **“Language”** field.
3. EndNote only abbreviates the name of the journal if the abbreviated name is listed in the **“Journal”** field of the reference (potential manual correction required).
4. EndNote does not recognize scientific names of species in reference titles and removes italic formatting (potential manual correction required).
5. References that are not yet published should have the phrase “in press” instead of the year of publication in text and Reference list. This can be achieved by entering the phrase “in press” in the field **“Year”** when creating new reference or editing imported one.
6. EndNote uses the DOI entered in **“DOI”** field of the reference. Please keep in mind that the Journal requires the DOI in shorter form beginning with 10 followed by a period, e.g.: 10.1037/a0028240 (potential manual correction required).
7. When creating references authored by departments, companies and institutions, please add a **comma** after the name of the institution in **“Author”** field in order to avoid abbreviating the full name of the institution in the Reference list.
